



Problem: Orphans in Cambodia

- ▶ About 350,000 orphans in the country
- ▶ More than 30,000 children orphaned due to HIV-AIDS last year
- ▶ Orphans are especially vulnerable in a traumatized and undeveloped country
- ▶ Siblings rarely stay together when orphaned in Cambodia

Budget for Garden of Joy

\$19,500 for Capital (onetime) expenses

\$17,000	Build houses (w/ furniture)
\$1,500	Landscape, sewage, water, etc.
\$500	Bicycles
\$500	Motorcycle

\$15,480 for Operating (annual) expenses

(budget based on 30 people during first year of operation)

\$5,400	Food
\$1,200	Household supplies
\$300	Medical expenses
\$5,400	Personnel/Admin (6 fulltime staff)
\$1,800	Children's care / education
\$900	Maintenance, yard, utilities
\$480	Emergency fund

Response: Garden of Joy

- ▶ A home giving love and support to children orphaned as their parents die from the effects of HIV-AIDS while living at Place of Peace.
- ▶ Caregivers will love and respect children and will provide holistic care and long-term nurture.

Garden of Joy will:

- ▶ Accept long-term responsibility for raising and nurturing all orphaned siblings in the family.
- ▶ In a positive and supportive environment, help children discover and use their skills, abilities and personal gifts in rewarding and fulfilling service to God and people.
- ▶ Help children know, love and worship God.
- ▶ Encourage and assist children to become godly Christian leaders who will make a positive impact in their family, their community, their church and their country.

Strategy:

- ▶ Provide a home in a rural community, near all levels of government schools, for up to 50 orphaned children.
- ▶ Encourage, motivate and equip Christian adults to guide, discipline, encourage and parent the children.
- ▶ Provide education for all children; in some cases, vocational training will substitute for government schooling.
- ▶ Strive to meet the emotional, physical and spiritual needs of the children.
- ▶ Develop a positive work ethic in each child by modeling hard work and service and providing opportunities for children to participate in chores and in community service.
- ▶ Provide extra-curricular activities that enable children to explore new skills and new ideas.
- ▶ In a kind, gentle and non-threatening manner, intentionally teach children about the God who created them, loves them, died for them, and wants to give them eternal life.
- ▶ Develop programs and an environment that develop godly character in the lives of adults and children.
- ▶ Encourage children to understand their gifts and pursue their personal dreams.
- ▶ In some cases, children orphaned outside the Place of Peace may be accepted.
- ▶ Include children in surrounding villages in as many activities as possible.
